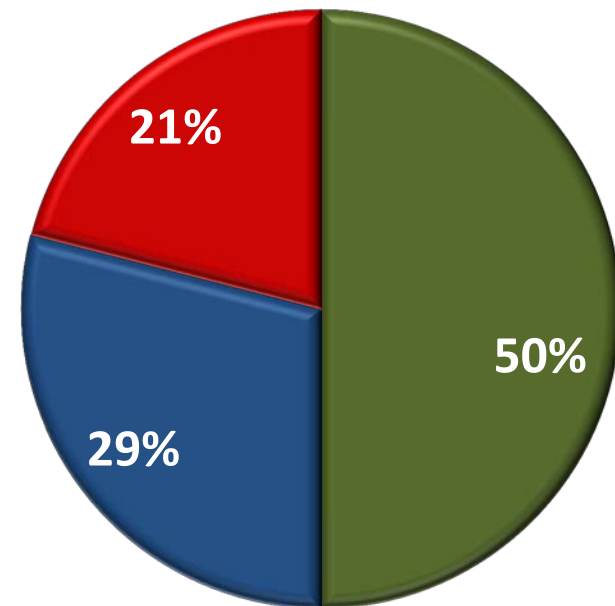

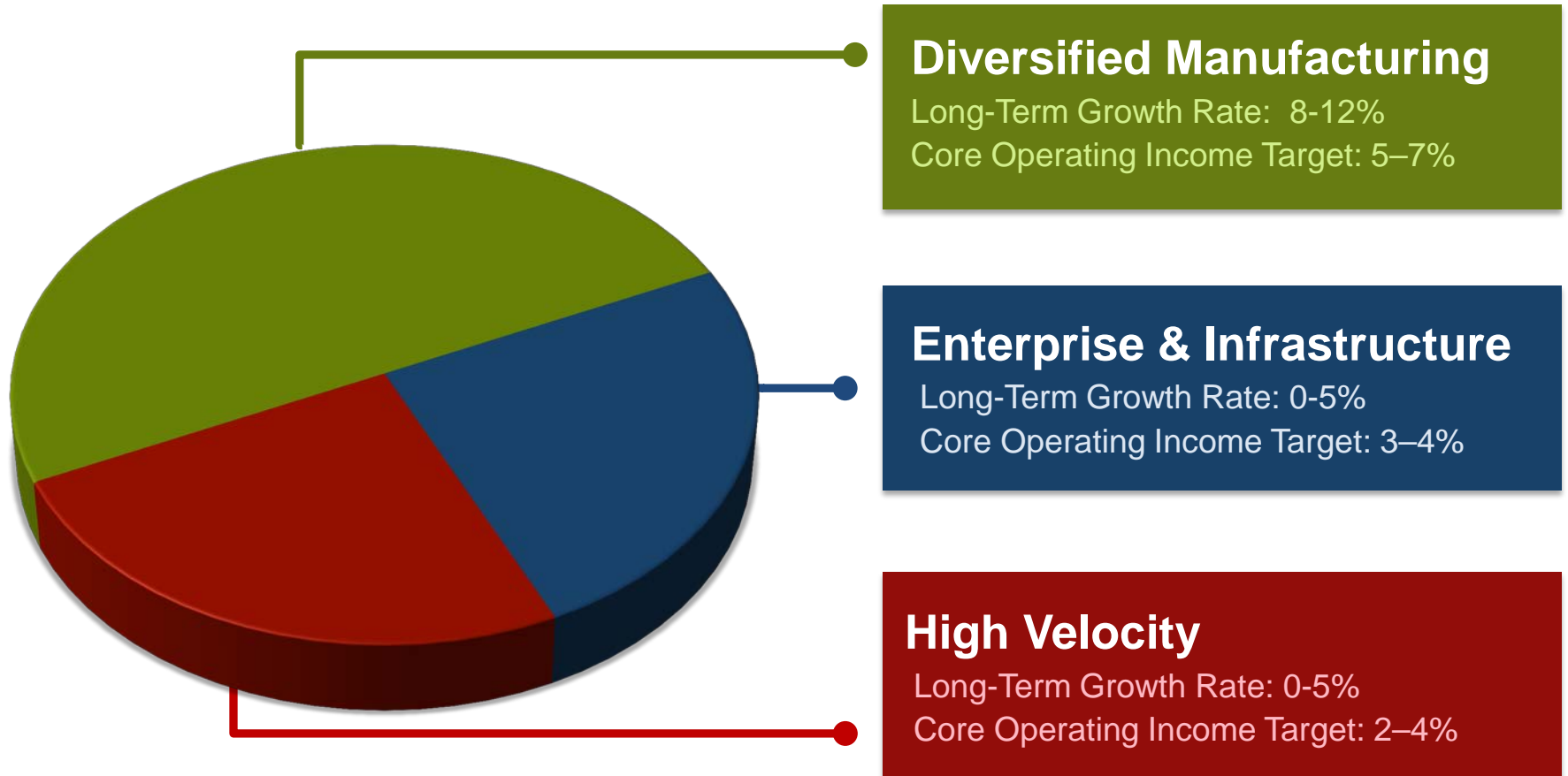

Reconciliation of Non-GAAP Financial Measures

The financial results disclosed in this presentation include certain measures calculated and presented in accordance with GAAP. In addition to the GAAP financial measures, Jabil provides supplemental, non-GAAP financial measures to facilitate evaluation of Jabil's core operating performance. The non-GAAP financial measures disclosed in this presentation exclude certain amounts that are included in the most directly comparable GAAP measures. The non-GAAP or core financial measures disclosed in this presentation do not have standard meaning and may vary from non-GAAP financial measures used by other companies. Management believes core financial measures are a useful measure that facilitate evaluating the past and future performance of Jabil's ongoing operations on a comparable basis. Jabil reports core operating income, core return on invested capital, core earnings and core earnings per share to provide investors an additional method for assessing operating income, earnings and earnings per share from what it believes are its core manufacturing operations.

Core Return on Invested Capital (ROIC) is calculated by annualizing the Company's after-tax non-GAAP fiscal year-to-date operating income and dividing that by an average net invested capital asset base. After-tax non-GAAP operating income excludes expenses and charges relating to the amortization of intangibles, stock-based compensation expense and related charges, restructuring and related charges, impairment of notes receivable and related charges, goodwill impairment charges, certain distressed customer charges, certain acquisition costs and purchase accounting adjustments, settlement of receivables and related charges and loss on disposal of subsidiaries, net of tax. The net invested capital is defined as the sum of the averages of stockholders' equity and current and non-current portions of notes payable and long term debt, adjusted for the average cash and cash equivalents. The average is based on the addition of the account balance as of the end of the Company's first fiscal quarter to the account balance as of the end of the Company's prior fiscal year and dividing by two.
7. Free Cash Flow defined as Cash Provided by Operating Activities less Net Cash used in Investing Activities.
